SPECIAL BOARD MEETING

The Galva-Holstein Board of Education met in special session on Tuesday, September 8, 2020, at 7:00 p.m. in the Galva-Holstein Board Room. Board members present: Grant Aschinger, Don Kalin, David Kistenmacher, Heather Pribble, Jamie Whitmer and Matthew Wittrock. Administrators: Superintendent Jon Wiebers.

Visitors: Tyler Gebers.

Call to order: President Whitmer at 7:01 p.m.

Motion by Wittrock, second by Kalin to approve agenda as presented. Motion carried 6-0.

Motion by Wittrock, second by Kistenmacher to appoint Tyler Gebers to fill the vacancy of Jeff Witzke on the Board until the November 2021 election. Roll vote—Ayes: Grant Aschinger, Don Kalin, David Kistenmacher, Heather Pribble, Jamie Whitmer and Matthew Wittrock. Nays: None. Motion carried

unanimously.

The oath of office was administered to Tyler Gebers.

Motion by Kistenmacher, second by Kalin to accept the resignation of Jill Steffen as custodian. Motion carried 7-0.

Motion by Pribble, second by Aschinger to accept the resignation of Ashley Thevenot as Little Raptor Day Care Director. Motion carried 7-0.

Motion by Kistenmacher, second by Kalin to approve the hiring of Brianna Witzke as Dance Team Sponsor at step 0 and a salary of \$1,509.50. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Wittrock, second by Pribble to approve the hiring of Darren Thorborg as custodian at \$12.50 per hour. Motion carried 7-0.

Motion by Kalin, second by Pribble to approve the hiring of Rochelle Thies as health aide at \$10.50 per hour. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Pribble, second by Kalin to approve lane and salary advancements

for Mary Kay Todd (Master's to Master's +15 with an increase of \$573.80 to base salary), Sydney Kinzer (Bachelor's +24 to Master's with an increase of \$860.70 to base salary), and Kris Kistenmacher (Bachelor's to Bachelor's +15 with an increase of \$1,147.60 to base salary). Motion carried 7-0.

Discussion ensued regarding Board directives, goals and priorities in regard to facilities' improvements, curriculum, community partnerships and the sharing agreement. A work session was set for September 21, following the regular school board meeting.

Before adjourning, Superintendent Wiebers updated the board on his plans for replacement of the day care director after her resignation.

With no further business to discuss, President Whitmer adjourned the meeting at 8:12 p.m..

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
