A voter who is unable to provide an approved form of identification (or prove residence if required) may 1) have the voter's identity/residence attested to by another registered voter in the precinct, 2) prove identity and residence using Election Day Registration documents, or 3) cast a provisional ballot and provide proof of identity/residence at the county auditor's office by Noon on Monday, June 10, 2024. Election Day Registrant attesters must provide an approved form of identification. **Early Notice and Public Review** of a Proposed Activity in a 100-Year Floodplain or Wetland

Publication Date: May 15, 2024 This is to give notice that the City of Holstein has conducted an evaluation as required by Executive Order 11988 and/or 11990, in accordance with HUD regulations at 24 CFR 55.20 Subpart C Procedures for Making Determinations on Floodplain Management, to determine the potential affect that its activity in the floodplain and wetland will have on the human environment for a CDBG Wastewater Plant Improvements Project (# 24-WS-007.

The project involves the construction of a new wastewater treatment process which includes a new SAGR treatment system and ultraviolet disinfection system. Specific components of the project include process piping, aeration piping. a splitter structure, blower building, electrical system, controls, and various other minor components. The project will be funded with a combination of CDBG funds and SRF

Loan. The project activities will take place at the City of Holstein Wastewater Treatment Facility located at 5600 German Avenue on the south side of the City. The activities will take place on land owned by the City of Holstein and will include less than 1

acre of floodplain and wetland. There are three primary purposes for this notice. First, people who may be affected by activities in floodplains and wetlands and those who have an interest in the protection of the natural environment should be given an opportunity to express their concerns and provide information about these areas. Second, an adequate public notice program can be an important public educational tool. The dissemination of information about floodplains and wetlands can facilitate and enhance Federal efforts to reduce the risks associated with the occupancy and modification of these special areas. Third, as a matter of fairness, when the Federal government determines it will participate in actions taking place in floodplains and wetlands, it must inform those who may be put at greater or continued risk.

Written comments must be received by the City of Holstein at the following address on or before May 30, 2024. City of Holstein, 119 S.
