Board of Supervisors convened in adjourned session, members present Chair Creston Schubert, Devlun Whiteing, and Raymond Drey.

The minutes of the meeting held Oct. 24, 2023, were read, and Corey Trucke, Deputy Sheriff/

County EMS Director was present, and a personnel discussion took Upon completion of his

probationary period, a salary certification for jailer, Kevin Mahlberg for \$23.29/hr effective 11/13/2023 was received. Whiteing moved and Drey seconded the motion to approve, it carried all County Engineer Jeff Williams

was present to discuss various road items. M15/Jasper Ave. is open. Various road projects were discussed, including some gravel road issues. Williams will provide to the Board, mapping of the areas that road operators cover. Since new operators have completed a year and are now successfully doing their jobs, upon their probationary period individual salary certifications will be presented at the next Board meeting.
The following Ida County

librarians/representatives were present: Jackie Netherton-Ida Grove Library Board President, Jackie Netherton-Ida Brenda Naberhaus-Galva City Librarian, and Emily Todd- Holstein Librarian. They shared that they are serving approximately 100 individuals each day the libraries are open within the County. In addition, for Ida County they shared that the Cities contribute about \$41/resident, and that the county currently contributes \$17/resident and they were requesting that County contribution be increased.

Ed Sohm was present and asked for a closed session per Iowa Code 21.5(i). At 10:26 a.m. the Board entered the closed session with the following roll call: Schubert-aye, Drey-aye and Whiteing-aye. CITY OF HOLSTEIN **PUBLIC HEARING NOTICE** 

The City of Holstein will be holding a Public Hearing to review an application for a State Revolving Fund (SRF) loan and to make available to the public the contents of an environmental information document and the City's project plan. These documents include design and environmental information related to the proposed improvements to the City's wastewater treatment system. The existing controlled discharge

wastewater lagoon site will be converted to a continuous discharge system with aerated lagoons, a submerged attached growth reactor (SAGR), and UV disinfection. The two north cells will be decommissioned. A new lift station will be installed at the northwest corner of the north cell property and convey wastewater to the south site. The southwest cell will remain and be split into aeration cells and a settling cell. The southeast cell will be decommissioned and the northernmost portion of this cell will contain the SAGR beds and a building to house the UV disinfection, blowers. and electrical equipment. Additional piping will be installed for wastewater conveyance and aeration and miscellaneous weir structures will be installed throughout the site. The purpose of this Public Hear-

ing is to inform area residents of the community of Holstein of this proposed action, discuss the actual cost and user fees associated with this project, and to address citizen's concerns, if any, with the plan. The Public Hearing location and
