**CITY OF HOLSTEIN
PUBLIC HEARING NOTICE**

The City of Holstein will be holding a Public Hearing to review an application for a State Revolving Fund (SRF) loan and to make available to the public the contents of an environmental information document and the City's project plan. These documents include design and environmental information related to the proposed improvements to the City's wastewater treatment system.

The existing controlled discharge wastewater lagoon site will be converted to a continuous discharge system with aerated lagoons, a submerged attached growth reactor (SAGR), and UV disinfection. The two north cells will be decommissioned. A new lift station will be installed at the northwest corner of the north cell property and convey wastewater to the south site. The southwest cell will remain and be split into aeration cells and a settling cell. The southeast cell will be decommissioned, and the northernmost portion of this cell will contain the SAGR beds and a building to house the UV disinfection, blowers, and electrical equipment. Additional piping will be installed for wastewater conveyance and aeration, and miscellaneous weir structures will be installed throughout the site.

The purpose of this Public Hearing is to inform area residents of the community of Holstein of this proposed action, discuss the actual cost and user fees associated with this project, and to address citizen's concerns, if any, with the plan.

Regular Joint Board Meeting
The Galva-Holstein Board of Education and the Schaller-Crestland Board of Education met in joint session on Monday, Nov. 13, 2023 at 7 p.m. in the Holstein media center with the following board members present: Don Kalin, Beth Schossow, Matthew Wittrock, Jamie Whitmer and Jeff Witzke. Absent: Grant Aschinger and Tyler Gebers.
Administrators present: Superintendent Adam Bisenius and AD Director Joel Brus.
Visitors to speak: Cody Wright and John Miller.
Call to order: President Whitmer at 7 p.m.
Motion by Kalin, second by Witzke

to approve agenda as presented. Motion carried 5-0.
In public comment, Cody Wright verbalized a request for open enrollment for his child with the option of immediate athletic eligibility. John Miller, director of the alternative school, thanked the boards for their support of the school. He believes this option will enable students, who may otherwise have dropped out of school, earn their diplomas.
Motion by Schossow, second by Kalin to approve minutes of the October regular board meeting. Motion carried 5-0.
Motion by Schossow, second by Witzke to approve summary list of bills as presented. Motion carried unanimously (bills reviewed by

Schossow prior to meeting).
Motion by Kalin, second by Wittrock to approve the financial reports for the month ending October 2023. Motion carried 5-0.
In principal and AD reports, Brus was present to inform the boards of participation numbers for the winter sports as well as upcoming events.
Motion by Witzke, second by Wittrock to approve the hiring of Corin Bower as an additional 4th grade teacher to begin at the beginning of the 2nd semester. Motion carried 5-0.
Motion by Wittrock, second by Witzke to set Dec. 11, 2023 at 5:30 p.m. in the Holstein media center for a public hearing to renew the instructional support levy. Motion

carried 5-0.
Motion by Wittrock, second by Witzke to vote for Henry Jessen as the district 9 director for the Northwest AEA board. Motion carried unanimously.
Motion by Kalin, second by Schossow to approve new board policies presented by Superintendent Bisenius. Motion carried unanimously.
Motion by Aschinger, second by Witzke to approve pro-ration figures for the first semester of 2023-2024 as follows: Galva-Holstein Middle School students – 47.93% - Schaller-Crestland Middle School students – 52.07%. Galva-Holstein High School students – 63.04% - Schaller-Crestland High School students – 36.96%. Motion carried 5-0.

Motion by Witzke, second by Kalin to move to closed session pursuant to section 22.7, subsection 50 of Iowa Code 21.5(l). The roll was taken: Ayes: Don Kalin, Beth Schossow, Mathew Wittrock, Jamie Whitmer and Jeff Witzke. Nays: None. (7:38 pm)
Motion by Witzke, second by Wittrock to end closed session. The roll was taken: Ayes: Don Kalin, Beth Schossow, Mathew Wittrock, Jamie Whitmer and Jeff Witzke. Nays: None. (7:59 pm)
Motion by Witzke, second by Wittrock to grant open enrollment request with immediate athletic eligibility. Motion carried 5-0.
In his superintendent report, Bisenius discussed his desire to have a

board retreat for goal setting when the new board members are in place sometime in December. He also updated the boards on facility projects, staffing needs and curriculum updates for elementary math. Finally, Bisenius elaborated on many of the accomplishments and successes from the fall season.
With nothing further to discuss, Whitmer adjourned the meeting at 8:03 p.m.
