The Galva-Holstein Board of Education met in joint session with the Schaller-Crestland Board of Education on Monday, May 8, 2023 at 7 p.m. in the Galva Holstein Media Center with the following board members present: Grant Aschinger (7:52 p.m.), Don Kalin, Beth Schossow, Jamie Whitmer and Matthew Wittrock. Absent: Tyler Gebers and Jeff Witzke.

Administrators present: Superintendent Adam Bisenius. Visitors: Melanie Pvle, Jane

Schomaker and Keelie Struck. Call to order: President Whitmer

at7 n m Motion by Wittrock, second by Kalin to approve agenda as presented. Motion carried 4-0.

In public comment, Keelie Struck addressed the boards to voice her concerns regarding the special education caseload for which she has been responsible for this year. She urged the board to find additional qualified staff to be able to help with IEPs and the general education of her students.

Motion by Schossow, second by Wittrock to approve the 3 sets of minutes from April. Motion carried 4-0.

Motion by Schossow, second by to Wittrock to approve the bills presented. Motion carried as unanimously. Bills reviewed by Schossow prior to board meeting.

Motion by Wittrock, second by Kalin to approve April 2023 financial reports. Motion carried 4-0.

Motion by Wittrock, second by Kalin to approve the resignation of Angela Doyel from the daycare. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Wittrock, second by Schossow to approve the amending of Joel Brus's contract at the middle school to .6 Teacher and .4 Activities Director. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Wittrock, second by Kalin to approve the hiring of Mike Modrell as a maintenance/custodial worker beginning June 1. Motion carried 4-0.

Motion by Kalin, second by Schossow to approve the recommended contract for Business Manager Kliegl for the 2023-24 fiscal year. Motion carried unanimously. Motion by Wittrock, second by

Kalin to approve the wage increases for support staff as presented for the 2023-24 fiscal year. Motion carried 3-1 (Schossow voted no).

Motion by Schossow, second by Kalin to adopt the redistricting plan of reducing from seven director districts to five director districts with two at-large directors, and adjusting director district boundaries and method of election following the 2020 decennial census. The roll was called and the vote was Aves: Kalin, Schossow, Whitmer and Wittrock. Nays: None. Motion carried 4-0.

Motion by Wittrock, second by Kalin to approve the agreement with WITCC for the purpose of providing concurrent enrollment for

college level courses to high school students for the 23-24 school year. Motion carried 4-0.

Motion by Wittrock second by Schossow to approve the coaching positions and salaries at the high school as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Wittrock, second by Schossow to approve the presented list of graduates for the Class of 2023 pending all requirements are met for each individual. Motion carried 4-0

At 7:46 p.m., motion by Wittrock, second by Kalin to enter closed session in accordance with Iowa Code 21.5(1) (i). The roll was taken and the vote was Aves: Kalin. Schossow, Wittrock and Whitmer. Nays: None. Motion carried 4-0.

Grant Aschinger entered the meeting 7:52 p.m.

At 8:02 p.m., motion by Wittrock second by Aschinger to come out of closed session. The roll was taken and the vote was Ayes: Aschinger, Kalin, Schossow, Whitmer and Wittrock. Nays: None. Motion carried 5-0.

In his superintendent report. Bisenius relayed updates from the legislative session that will impact schools. He showed board member sample drawings from Pilot Rock of ways to "brand" the school, starting in the new gym area. He also updated the boards on staffing positions that are open in the district. The possibility of starting an alternative school was discussed. The boards also discussed the possibility of having a junior high girls wrestling season to coincide with the high school girls season.

With no other business to discuss, Whitmer adjourned the meeting at 8:37 p.m. The next regularly scheduled board meeting will be at 7 p.m. in
