In public comment, Griffin addressed the boards to suggest consolidation or beginning the grade-sharing arrangement at a lower grade level than the current agreement. Motion by Ruble, second by Witzke to approve minutes from January's joint board meeting. Motion carried 4-0. Motion by Ruble, second by Witzke to approve bills as presented. Motion carried unanimously. Ruble reviewed the bills prior to the meeting. Motion by Vohs, second by Ruble to approve financial reports for January 2026 as presented. Motion carried unanimously. Motion by Witzke, second by Ruble to approve resignations effective the end of the fiscal year from Tyler Wingert (Ag/FFA), Jeanne Bell

(TAG/Elementary Art) and Patrick Miller (Elementary Principal). Motion carried 4-0. Motion by Ruble, second by Vohs to approve the hiring of Barry Andersen as head softball coach. Motion carried 4-0. Motion by Ruble, second by Vohs to approve the hiring of Shannon Tesch as assistant softball coach. Motion carried unanimously. Motion by Ruble, second by Vohs to approve the hiring of Kylie Robinson as assistant softball coach pending the release from her contract to coach Alta-Aurelia softball. Motion carried unanimously. Motion by Witzke, second by Vohs to approve the hiring of Eric Myrtue as head baseball coach. Motion carried 3-1 (Nay by Ruble). Motion by Witzke, second by Vohs to approve the hiring of Jacob Myrtue as assistant baseball coach. Motion carried 4-0. Superintendent Bisenius' board report relayed legislative items that could affect school districts in Iowa. He also presented dates for possible public hearings for the 26-27 school budget. Witrock adjourned the meeting at 8 p.m. The next regularly scheduled meeting will be at 7 p.m. at the Galva-Holstein Media Center on March 9.
